BACHELOR OF ARTS IN POLITICAL SCIENCE



This program prepares students for diverse careers in the public, private, law-related, and nonprofit sectors. Also, this B.A. in Political Science degree is a very good foundation for advanced degrees in public administration, public policy, political science, nonprofit management, and law.

TARGET AUDIENCE

Students with an AA or AS or a minimum of 60 semester hours and who are interested careers in public administration, public policy, political science, law, nonprofit and/or business management.
