The Master of Arts in Differentiated Instruction is designed for current educators with two to ten years of experience who are interested in leading change and reform efforts in their educational settings. These educators would be those looking for knowledge, skills, and dispositions to act as teacher-leaders in planning and implementing differentiated instructional improvements and curricular enhancements as they relate to all students. Candidates will:

- Think critically, creatively, and analytically in ways that promote meaningful teaching and learning experiences.
- Be able to articulate learning theory, assess students' needs and develop curriculum and instructional strategies to meet those needs.
- Master a variety of cognitive and learning theories, differentiation in the content areas, instructional technology across the curriculum, various instructional approaches and the importance of managing the differentiated learning environment using research-based instructional strategies and data-driven decision making.

TARGET AUDIENCE:

Classroom teachers who have a minimum of two years of lead-teaching experience.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

1. Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution.
2. Graduate admission application including an objective statement.
3. Official transcripts from Bachelor's degree (and for any Master's degree earned as well).
4. Evidence of ability to achieve success:
 - a. for regular graduate status, a grade-point average (GPA) of 2.85/4.0 or better in all previous college work, or
 - b. for probationary status, a GPA of 2.25 to 2.84
5. Two letters of recommendation (preferably one from a college or university instructor) addressing academic proficiency, personal character, and competence and effectiveness in professional work.
