Graduates who meet all requirements and receive licensure from the state are entitled to work with children from birth through age 8 and to teach Pre-K through Grade 3 in Illinois public schools and similar organizations that require licensure. Three degree tracks are offered to suit your needs.

TARGET AUDIENCE:

Individuals with recent coursework in ECE from CLC or other accredited institution whose career plans include working in Illinois grade schools or daycares.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- Admissions application with \$25.00 application fee and completed personal statement
- All official college transcripts.
- Transfer students with less than 24 quarter hrs. must also submit high school transcripts.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE:
