# **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:**

- 3. Official transcripts from every college or university attended

Students must have:

- Completed at least 90 quarter hours (60 sh) with at least a 2.0 grade point average
- 2. Access to the Internet and a computer running Windows
- COMPASS Writing and Math examinations taken prior to registration for the second term; official scores for math (44 or better) & writing (65 or better).

Upon admission, students will be assigned an academic advisor to assist them in completing all degree requirements and in registering each term. New students are encouraged to attend a New Student Orientation at NLU.

NLU has a 50 QH residency requirement for the BSMIS program, and requires that the final 12 quarter hours be taken at NLU.
