TRANSFER HOURS POLICY:

Credit may be given for previous work experience, technical training, and course work taken at other institutions. SIUC delivers the 36 semester-hour Workforce Education Development (WED) major. Students complete all other degree requirements through transfer credit.

TOTAL HOURS NEEDED:

121 total semester hours including credit for 4 years of full-time work experience needed to graduate.
