TARGET AUDIENCE:

The Master of Science in Education Degree, with a major in Workforce Education and Development, is designed to accommodate a broad range of individuals preparing for teaching and non-teaching roles in education, business, industry, government, and other fields.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Interested students must apply and be accepted into the SIUC Graduate School. Admission in Summer semester only. Current requirements are a 2.7 GPA and a career goal that is congruent with WED's program purpose. Bachelor's degree completion must be listed on student's transcript by at least the term prior to admission. Relevant professional or technical experience (at least two years) is recommended.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR:

Fall, spring, and summer terms.

DELIVERY MODE:

Courses are offered by a combination of course deliveries: face-to-face on weekends in Lake County, online, and through interactive video. Attendance at a two-week summer session (two weeks in June) on the Carbondale campus to earn 6 credit hours is needed.

LOCATION(S) OF COURSES:

Great Lakes Naval Training Center and University Center in Grayslake

TEXTBOOK PURCHASE:

Textbooks may be purchased over the internet or through the SIUC Bookstore.

TRANSFER HOURS POLICY:

15 semester hours of coursework from other universities may be used as transfer electives. These hours must be:

- a. regular graduate-level courses earned from an accredited university,
- b. related to the student's career goal and approved by the director of the Office of Graduate Programs,
- c. completed for a letter grade of at least a "B",
- d. earned before, during or after completing the SIUC work, and
- e. completed within six years of graduation.

TOTAL HOURS NEEDED:

36 semester hours (nonthesis option) or 32 hours (thesis option) are required for the MS in Education Degree for students with bachelor's degrees in education/training. Two additional foundation courses (WED 466 and 486) are required for students with noneducation backgrounds
