TARGET AUDIENCE:

School leaders in the K-12 schools in the region.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Candidates are required to have a Master's degree. Must also demonstrate leadership experience. Must apply to the Department and the Graduate School, take the Graduate Record Examination, and participate in a screening interview.

Western Illinois University also offers guaranteed tuition for graduate students. Students eligible for the graduate cost quarantee must meet the following:

- Must be enrolled in a graduate degree program (unclassified graduate students will not be eligible);
- The guarantee will be for four consecutive years. If the student has not finished the degree program within four years, the rate will be advanced by two years and will continue for another two years;
- If the student becomes unclassified during the guarantee program, he/ she will be moved to the current rates and will not be covered by the guarantee until enrolled in a degree program;
- The guarantee will cover persemester-hour tuition rate.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE:

Registration is completed by the student electronically through the WIU STARS system.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR:

Fall, Spring and Summer Sessions. Doctoral students are required to maintain continuous enrollment.

DELIVERY MODE:

3-cr courses in Educational Leadership will use video conferencing, face-toface, Skype, and online/hybrid activities. Some courses and/or sessions will be held on the Moline campus and will be scheduled on weekends.

Grayslake, Macomb, and Moline, Illinois.
