The program emphasizes the strategic importance of supply chain design, planning, and implementation and covers a variety of analytical and technology tools used in optimizing supply chain performance.

Designed for business professionals seeking a comprehensive understanding of the roles of and the interrelationships between the various functions and stages within a holistic supply chain.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- An application for admission to graduate study from Elmhurst College.
- Three professional recommendations from individuals who can comment on your leadership qualities, communication skills, personal motivation and capacity to succeed in graduate study.
- A statement of purpose (1,000 words) describing your personal and professional goals and how the completion of the graduate degree will enhance them.
- Official transcripts from all undergraduate and graduate institutions you have attended.
- A current résumé documenting your work history.
- At least three years of work experience in any area of business.

Interested students are not required to submit graduate examination scores. The program director may require TOEFL scores. All candidates will be required to appear for an interview.
