

# BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN ORGANIZATIONAL DEVELOPMENT



The Organizational Development Bachelor of Science Degree Program is in the Lumpkin College of Business and Applied Sciences, School of Technology. Organizational Development is a distinct field of academic study preparing students for positions as supervisors, project leaders, change agents, and trainers in a variety of organizational settings.

## TARGET AUDIENCE:

This program has been devoted to serving educational needs by offering courses in alternative formats (weeknights, weekends, and online) and at various locations.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

1. Have earned a minimum of 30 credit hours from an accredited institution;
2. Have earned a cumulative GPA of at least 2.50 or higher;

Students who do not meet these admission requirements, but meet EIU's general transfer admission requirements, will have their applications reviewed by the OPD coordinator. Following this review, students may be required to participate in a pre-entry interview or submit a new application for consideration at a later time.

## COST:

- \$30 application fee
- Tuition: \$289.00 per credit hour
- Continuing Education Fee: \$44\* per credit hour
- Textbook rental fee: \$9.75 per credit hour

## REGISTRATION PROCEDURE:

Registration is done using PAWS, an online student information portal. Academic Advisors are available to assist with registration if needed.

## DELIVERY MODE:

## LOCATION(S) OF COURSES:

University Center facility in Grayslake. Online classes are also available every semester.

## TEXTBOOK PURCHASE:

Students rent their textbooks from EIU. Textbooks are mailed to students via UPS one week before the class begins. For face to face classes, the instructor may bring the books to the first class session.

## TRANSFER HOURS POLICY:

The OPD program will accept up to 95 semester hours of transfer credit from regionally accredited colleges and universities; 78 semester hours may be transferred from community colleges.

## TOTAL HOURS NEEDED:

A minimum of 120 semester hours of credit.
