

CERTIFICATE IN PUBLIC PLANNING

ONLINE



The Certificate in Public Planning provides a foundation in geographic information systems training, coupled with graduate level coursework in public administration and public policy, to prepare students for careers or advancement in public planning, nonprofit and community organizations, and related fields.

TARGET AUDIENCE:

Individuals seeking to expand career options in public planning and related professions

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- Official transcripts indicating that the student earned a Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university
- A minimum 2.75 cumulative g.p.a. in the last 60 hours of undergraduate studies.
- Two letters of recommendations.
- Professional goals statement.
- The GRE is not required.

COST:

Fees Include:

- Application Fee: \$30 (see above Admission Requirement information)
- Tuition: \$292 per credit hour
- Continuing Education Fee: \$44* per credit hour
- Textbook Rental Fee: \$9.75 per credit hour
