REQUIRED COURSES:

Thesis Option – 32 hours of credit required, including ME599 - Thesis. 16 hours must be at the 500-level with two of the three courses taken in mechanical engineering.

Non-Thesis Option – 36 hours of credit required, including ME 597 - Independent Study (non-thesis project). 12 hours of 500-level courses, two of which must be in mechanical engineering.

TARGET AUDIENCE:

Individuals interested in completing an MS degree in mechanical engineering or taking courses for professional development. Individuals must have a BS degree in mechanical engineering from an ABET accredited institution. Both thesis and non-thesis options are available.
