The interdisciplinary MA in Aging Studies program at Eastern Illinois University is an approximately five semester graduate program structured to facilitate maximum support for our graduate students. The Master's degree has been in existence at EIU for over thirty years and holds the prestigious National Program of Merit status. In response to the needs of working professionals, the Master's program is an online degree program. Our interdisciplinary Master's degree prepares professionals for entering or continuing diverse careers in the field of aging.

TARGET AUDIENCE:

Our program welcomes returning students, as well as those just completing their undergraduate degree.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA is 2.75
- GRE is not required
- Online application to the Graduate School http://www.eiu.edu/ma_agingstudies/applicationprocess.php
- 1-2 page essay (see website for questions)
- Two letters of recommendation. (See website for details.)

COST:

Estimated cost for the entire 33 credit hour program (including all fees and books) is \$12,000 for the program.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE:

After applicants are accepted to the program, they will have access to the PAWS registration system at the university.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR:

Courses are offered in a rotation in Fall, Spring, and Summer semesters.

DELIVERY MODE:

All courses are online. For interested students, a limited number of courses are offered in a face-to-face classroom on EIU's main campus.

LOCATION(S) OF COURSES:

Online plus optional courses in Charleston, Illinois.

TEXTBOOK PURCHASE:

Students at Eastern Illinois University use a convenient textbook rental service for all of their books. Students pay a flat fee each semester for their books and textbook rental service will mail students their books.

TRANSFER HOURS POLICY:

Up to 11 transfer credit hours awarded will be evaluated on an individual basis with the assistance of the Graduate School and the Aging Studies Graduate Coordinator.
