MUSIC EDUCATION CONCENTRATION



The Master of Arts in Music, Music Education Concentration provides a course of study that is primarily online with a one-week residency on the EIU campus. The curriculum design allows working music educators to apply new ideas and teaching techniques directly to their classrooms as they advance through the program.

TARGET AUDIENCE:

This program is specifically designed for music educators who are working full-time and want to earn a degree while continuing to teach.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Applicants must meet the requirements for admission to the Graduate School. They must have an undergraduate degree in music education and a minimum of one year teaching experience.

COST:

2019-20 fee summary:

- Tuition: \$296.00 per credit hour
- Textbook Rental Fee: \$9.75 per credit hour
- Continuing Education Fee: \$44.00 per credit hour*
- Technology Fee: \$20.00 per credit hour
- In addition, there is a \$20 administrative fee per class (not credit hour).
